BIMP-EAGA Food, Agribusiness and Logistics Corridors (Indicative Mapping)





Figure 2. EAGA Economic Corridors viz Proposed Food Corridors





What's in BIMP-EAGA?

- Ranks as the world's largest concentration of major tropical treecrops (palm oil, rubber, coconut, coffee and cocoa)
- Tree-crop exports at \$75-B a year, over half of global total:
 - ✓ Palm oil exports at \$35 billion; Rubber at \$29 billion

 Together, palm oil, rubber, palm oil kernel and coconut oil account for 80 percent of world exports

 Global player in banana (Philippines with 12 percent) and pineapples (PHL, Indonesia, Malaysia with 32 percent)



What's in BIMP-EAGA?

- Global player in marine products (tuna industry by Indonesia and Philippines)
- World supplier of seaweeds (Mindanao, Palawan and Sulawesi)
- Part of Coral Triangle the global epicenter of marine life abundance and bio-diversity





ASEAN's biggest free trade pact to date, with a market of 2.2 billion people and a combined size of US\$26.2 trillion or 30% of the world's GDP.





